the missing link

"the young man replied, 'i've kept all these. what am i still missing?' Jesus said, if you want to be complete, go, sell what you own, and give the money to the poor. then you will have treasure in heaven. and come follow me.'" matt 19:20-21 ceb

no - i'm not talking about the evolution of man. i'm talking about the revelation of man. the hebrew word for repent means "to turn" or "turn back." over and over the prophets proclaimed, "turn back to God and He will turn back to you!"

the early disciples walked in that power. they exercised the authority given to them. not given to them alone. "for the promise is unto you, and to your children, and to all that are afar off, even as many as the Lord our God shall call." acts 2:39

the trouble is, christians have taken the narrow way and widened it. it's not come as you are and stay as you are. it's go and sin no more. bring forth acts worthy of repentance. it's not just the wholly delivered that have access to this power and authority. it is the wholly committed. that all it takes. everything. is one little lifetime too much to pay for endless time?
